Would you like to take part in a study about experiences of genomics research (100,000 Genome Project) to develop a web resource for other patients, the public and healthcare professionals?

We would like to interview people who have been invited to take part in the 100,000 Genome Project. We are interested in hearing the experiences of people who took part in the project and those who decided not to take part. We will publish the study findings on www.healthtalk.org, an award-winning website that provides access to the experiences of others who have faced the same concerns or health experiences. On the website you can read, hear or watch the accounts of people describing their experiences of many different health conditions.

Healthtalk is used to help support others going through similar experiences, and help train doctors, nurses, GPs and other health professionals to understand people's experiences of taking part in genomics research.
